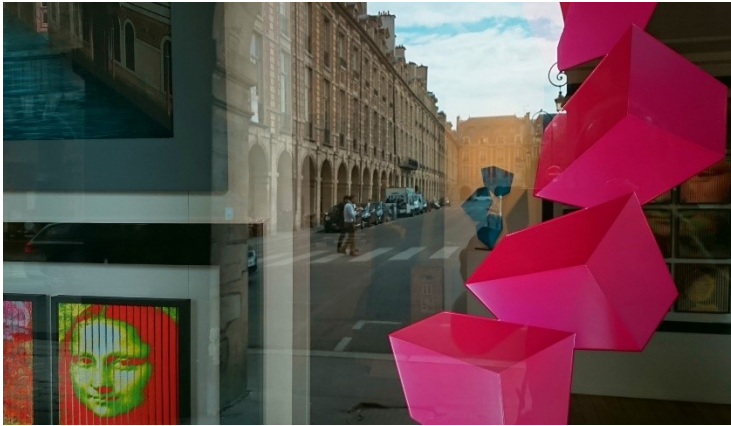

Despite being under immense pressure, she graciously agreed to find an hour for me at her home in the Adelaide foothills. Acutely aware of Nicola's long days at work, I wanted this to be a chance to relax. Loving the outdoors, she chose to sit in the sunlight on her verandah with a cup of tea. Nicola is delicately beautiful with smiling eyes and laughter lines. She is also calm, confident and quietly firm. Her glamorous salt and pepper hair and immaculate make up contrast markedly with the short unpainted nails on her strong, practical Doctor's hands. As she cradled her favourite mug, I imagined those hands holding tiny babies, her own as well as the patients she treated during her career as a Pediatrician. Over the last few months of televised press conferences, Nicola's face and hair have become familiar to all South Australians. We have had relatively few coronavirus cases here, perhaps in part because we have been fortunate that Nicola Spurrier cradles the health of this state in her capable hands.</p>
