		characteristics of the world we see. I attempted to underline this and make the linear qualities of the image dominate this piece. In this instance, I painted gestures in a free-form abstract style using a paint program, then imported the resulting image into a number of other apps to manipulate the flat image in a 3D Height Map process until I got what appeared to be geographic strata features in a landscape. This preserved the form's planarity while converting the various colours to varying elevations based on hue and tonality. After that, I adjusted the hue and tonality using a channel reflector process to emphasise the linear elements in the image until I was satisfied. To acquire it, sometimes you have to spend a lot of time experimenting with different programs.



		unpredictability of nature, of forces both seen and unseen, continues to influence the choices I make in my studio. 'Emerge' attempts to capture the unpredictable and unseen forces of the ocean currents and the 'Roaring Forties', which are strong westerly winds found in the Southern Hemisphere, generally between the latitudes of 40°S and 50°S and which helped shorten the journey of ships who were heading along the Southern Australian coastline through Bass Strait. Through a family diary found in the Tasmanian Archives, I discovered that some of my maternal ancestors also lived on the coast, on King Island, Ilutruwita (Tasmania), in the middle of Bass Strait in the early 1800's. A sealer lived and raised a family with a Tasmanian First Nations woman. The archives reveal that such relationships were often coercive. Whilst I do not personally or culturally identify as a First Nations person, my work often addresses my maternal ancestral history, and highlights information that has been hidden or rendered invisible in colonial narratives.
